Heating/Cooling:

• Thermostat in the dining room by the basement door.

- o 68 Degrees is typically a comfortable temp Please do NOT exceed 70 degrees
- Please put heat back down to 60 degrees when you depart
- Basement thermostat is located at the bottom of the stairs. This controls the propane fireplace. Please keep off when not using the home or when you depart
- AC units are located in each bedroom and one in the living room. Please make sure you don't leave these running when you depart or are gone for long periods of time.

Trash & Returnables:

• We recycle all cans and bottles in the correctly labeled bins by the fridge. Please put trash out on the front porch in the barrel next to black stone grill. Leave returnables inside in the bin.

Entertainment

- Large flat screen TV with streaming capabilities in living room
- Dvd's, games located in draws below living room TV
- "Man Cave" basement includes, poker table, pool table, darts, & more! Check it out. *We do advise the game room in the basement is geared towards the young adults and up, fun for all but we like to be upfront if you have children. There are posters and alcohol related signs.

Outdoor Space:

- Fire pit is available to use; clean up after yourselves and do not leave food or trash outside.
- We keep 8 Adirondack chairs stacked under the deck. Please put the furniture back when you are done using it.
- Activities located in the basement: Please return any games back to their spot when you're done.
 - o Cornhole, Ladder Ball, Life Jackets, Paddles, etc.

Things to Note

We Provide

- Linens, pillows, blankets/comforters, towels, and face clothes
- Toilet paper and paper towels, basic cleaning products available under kitchen sink, vacuum is located in the closet in downstairs bedroom.
- Washer & Dryer is free to use

Care of Blackstone Grill

- 1.) Please oil griddle before use to prevent sticking. Turn on the grill and use the squirt bottle provided to oil surface. Oil should spread out as heated but you can use paper towels and tongs to help the process along if you want to.
- 2.) Once you have finished using the grill, use the scrapper provided (should be on the bakers rack in the kitchen) and scrap debris and oil off grill. If you have any stuck on food, do the process while still warm and put a little oil on to steam off stuck on food. Thoroughly wipe with paper towels and tongs when you are done to prevent rusting.
- 3.) Once grill has cooled down thoroughly, please cover the grill using both covers provided. This will also prevent rusting of surface.

General Rules

- During your stay, you have full access of the house and property.
- *No smoking* or vaping inside the house (cigarettes or otherwise).
- *No fireworks* are to be used on the property. Maine law requires the consent of property owners to display fireworks on private property. The use of fireworks is NOT consented.
- No parties or events without owner's written permission.
- *No additional guests other than those accounted for in booking.*
- No *Pets!* There will be a \$100 fee if this house rule is broken.
- Please reuse towels throughout your stay if possible. We've allocated 2 per guest. In addition, we have a surplus of cleaning products under the bathroom sink if needed

Lake Usage

- Flagstaff Lake is available to you for swimming, kayaking and boating. You are welcome to use our water crafts (*at your own risk*) and use our personal floatation devices or bring your own.
- Kayaks must be taken care of after every use and kept orderly on the rack. The life jackets should be left in the sun to dry before putting them back in the basement as they were found.
- *Swimming Recommendations*: In front of the home is swimmable, however it is shallow and bit grassy/mucky. We'd recommend some local spots:
 - · Myers Beach
 - Cathedral Pines campground
 - Dead River Boat Launch/Bridge to jump off (only a mile north of the home)

Check-Out Instructions

Check-out is promptly at 10am, please follow instructions below

If you'd like a later check out time we kindly ask for you to send your host/co-host a message before your departure day. This accommodation can NOT always be guaranteed in case of a same day check in, but we're happy too if possible. Thank you!

<u>Departure</u>: We ask that you leave the home as you found it and respect the space as if it were your own. All furniture should be back as it was and all dishes washed and returned to their place. If any damage is to occur *please* notify your host.

- Remove all used bed linens (leave comforters in bedrooms) and towels and place in the first floor bathroom.
- Feel free to start a load of laundry if you don't mind! Let your host know if you do. Thanks
- Please empty the fridge and take all food you brought home with you
- Trash should be disposed of in barrel on front porch

Don't Forget!

- Take a look around for personal items (check bathrooms, closets/drawers, under beds, etc.)

- Make sure outdoor space is as you found it, kayaks are put away and locked up and key is put back in its place
