

Trash & Returnables:

• We recycle all cans and bottles, please leave inside, but we'd like for you to please remove trash and put in the trash barrel off the front steps.

Outdoor Space:

- Blackstone flat top grill is on the deck, *it's very important to <u>clean it after</u> use while it's still hot!*
- Fire pit is available to use; clean up after yourselves and do not leave food or trash outside.
- We keep 4 Adirondack chairs on upper deck.

General Rules

- During your stay, you have full access to the house and property, personal items and tools in basement are NOT accessible

Closest Hospital

• Franklin Memorial Hospital located in Farmington, ME. Please keep an eye on your pets and children at all times and do not let them outside unattended.

Lake Usage

- Flagstaff Lake is available to you for swimming, kayaking and boating. Pines Market rents kayaks and stand up paddle boards.
- *Swimming Recommendations:* In front of the home is swimmable, however it is shallow and a bit grassy/mucky. We'd recommend some local spots:
 - Myers Beach
 - Cathedral Pines Campground
 - Dead River Boat Launch/Bridge to jump off

Check-Out Instructions

Check-out is promptly at 10am, please follow instructions below

<u>Departure</u>: We ask that you leave the home as you found it and respect the space as if it were your own. All furniture should be back as it was and all dishes washed and returned to their place. If any damage is to occur *please* notify your host.

- *Remove all used bed linens* (leave comforters in bedrooms) *and towels* and place in first floor bathroom
- Please empty the fridge and take all food you brought home with you
- Trash should be disposed of in barrel right of the front steps.
